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BRYANT GARDENS REFINANCES MORTGAGE AND ESTABLISHES NEW RESERVE FUND

With interest rates on the rise, the Board felt that now would be a good time to refinance the mortgage on our property and lock in a lower interest rate. The rate on the existing mortgage was 5.16%.

On May 21, 2018, we refinanced the mortgage at 4.39% “fixed for the ten-year term”. The new mortgage amount is \$14,000,000. The balance upon maturity will be \$10,092,000.

The net proceeds to Bryant Gardens Corp from refinancing the mortgage established a Reserve Fund of \$6,500,000. The Reserve or Capital Expense Fund let's us pay for infrastructure projects (see next topic) without increasing the monthly maintenance or imposing a surcharge or assessment.

CAPITAL PROJECTS, UPGRADES AND REPLACEMENTS

Capital Improvements that are being considered or already underway for 2018 include:

- * Repairs of the facades of Buildings 1 & 3, including brickwork, foundation, etc.
- * Milling and paving of the parking lot and driveway behind Buildings 1 & 3
- * Replacement and upgrade of the domestic hot water system in Buildings 6 & 13
- * Replacement of the trees and evergreen plantings along the Bryant Avenue fence
- * Expansion of the underground irrigation system
- * Repainting of the Laundry Rooms and the basement walls, doors and floors
- * Replacement of the underground heating main between buildings 6 & 7

BRYANT GARDENS COMMUNITY CENTER

At the Annual Shareholders Meeting in May, the firm of KG&D Architects, which was retained to perform a feasibility study, presented conceptual designs for a new Bryant Gardens Community Center. In one scenario, the all-new building might contain a 1,500 sq. ft. Gym and a 2,000 sq. ft. Community room.

The Community Room could be used for activities from meetings, to family gatherings, movie or bingo night, educational meetings, book or card clubs, children's activities, and the list goes on. The Gym could be outfitted with state-of-the-art equipment from treadmills to recumbent bikes and free weights, and include space for exercise, Yoga, or Tai Chi classes and the like. In emergencies, the Community Center could function as a warming or cooling center.

The next step is to get your input. The Board of Directors needs your opinion and feedback. We will be surveying shareholders and hosting several special meetings for you to tell us what you think about the proposed Center.

UPDATED HOUSE RULES
